



Britax Purchase Path

Having a baby can be overwhelming. Trying to navigate through the new world of baby gear, including car seats, that accompanies having a baby can be overwhelming as well. For that reason, we recommend the following *Purchase Path* as a guide for which child seats you should use to keep your precious cargo protected from their very first car ride until they're ready to ride without a child restraint at all.



Infant Carrier



Can be used up to **30 pounds**
(depending on the model)

Many infant carriers are compatible with select strollers to create convenient travel systems.



Convertible Car Seat



Can be used rear facing up to **35 pounds** and then forward facing up to **65 pounds**
(depending on the model)

According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, it is best for your child to ride rear-facing to the highest weight or height allowed by the manufacturer of her car safety seat.



Combination Seat



Can be used with a five-point harness up to **80 pounds** and then converted to a belt-positioning booster to accommodate your child up to **100+ pounds** (depending on the model)

Once your child has moved into a combination seat, such as the Frontier combination Harness-2-Booster™ seat, you can pass their convertible car seat on to your next child.
